SPEAKER:

Hal Freshley has served as Planning and Policy Coordinator for the Minnesota Board on Aging since 1997. His work at the MN Department of Human Services has included *Project 2030*—raising public awareness of “demographic change” in Minnesota over the next three decades and the implications for both state government and communities. He is also involved in the *Survey of Older Minnesotans*—a study of the needs and resources of a sample of 2,250 persons age 55 and older in the state.

Prior to working with the Minnesota Department of Human Services, Hal was a planner at the Metropolitan Council. He helped develop and evaluate programs for older people. Before coming to Minnesota, Hal conducted research and taught at the University of Missouri and University of Michigan. He currently has an adjunct appointment at the Humphrey Institute at the University of Minnesota. He received his Ph.D. in Public Health from the University of Oklahoma.

Workplace demographics are changing! Experts tell us there are not enough new entrants to the workforce to meet the staffing needs of today’s businesses. The number of older adults in the workplace is increasing and businesses will continue to need both groups of employees to achieve their goals.
