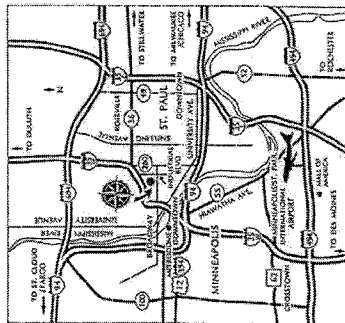

**From West**

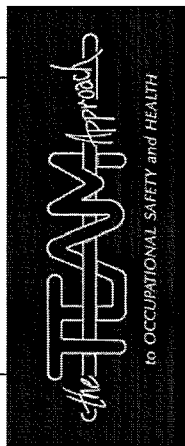

## Health Effects Among World Trade Center Rescue and Recovery Workers

**Stephen Levin, M.D.**, Mount Sinai-Irving J. Selikoff Center for Occupational & Environmental Medicine, New York, N.Y.

### Topic Description:

In response to the events of September 11, 2001, Dr. Levin led a team that developed a program to provide evaluation and treatment of patients who have developed respiratory and psychological illnesses as a consequence of their exposures and experiences at or near the site of the World Trade Center (WTC) disaster. He was Co-Director of the WTC Worker and Volunteer Medical Screening Program, funded by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, which provided medical assessments, diagnostic referrals and occupational health education for 12,000 workers and volunteers who performed rescue and recovery work at the WTC site. He also served as Principal Investigator and Director of the Data and Coordination Center for the federally funded WTC Medical Monitoring Program that provides repeat examinations for the WTC responder cohort that now number over 17,000 examinees. Come hear Dr. Stephen Levin discuss the on-going health surveillance programs set up for individuals involved in the World Trade Center recovery and demolition project.

You will receive handouts with resources for future reference. A question and answer period will follow the presentation.

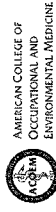
