

**AIHA-UMS Hosts a TeleWeb Virtual Seminar:  
Introduction to Chemical, Biological and Radiological/Nuclear Agents (CBRN) and  
Consequence Management**

The intent of this course is to provide the occupational health and safety professional with a basic background and understanding of the threat from CBRN materials, their mechanisms of action, and treatment modalities. TeleWeb attendees will learn key information needed to identify and list:

- Major chemical warfare agents and their characteristics, toxicology, symptoms of exposure, and treatment
- Five primary biological threat agents, the symptoms of exposure, and treatment
- Primary hazards associated with exposure to the three types of ionizing radiation, the methods for reducing exposure, and the treatment for exposure.

In addition, Cdr. Jederberg and Capt. Still will discuss:

- Community/company disaster planning and the role of the occupational health professional in such planning
- Incident Command System and attendee's potential roles in crisis response
